Introduction

Supply Chains

Our operations are UK-based, and we source goods and services from predominantly UK-based suppliers whose supply chains extend globally. We acknowledge that no supply chain can be considered entirely free from the potential for slavery or human trafficking to occur and we therefore continue to assess potential high-risk areas. We take appropriate action where necessary to ensure we are only working with suppliers who share our zero-tolerance approach to slavery and human trafficking. As well as assessing our current suppliers, we follow a process for assessing new suppliers that aims to ensure they are compliant themselves. We also regularly review our assessment approach to ensure it is in line with current legislation and effective in identifying risks.

Staff are encouraged to report any concerns relating to our direct activities or those of our supply chains.
